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7. DISCIPLINE OBJECTIVES (based on the grid of specific competences acquired)

7.1 The general objective of the discipline	<p>The present course is created both for beginners and for advances students, for all those who wish to develop and extend their Medical English Language knowledge.</p> <p>The course offers English language notions as well as notions of medical English. The course develops and improves the fluency of speech, writing, reading, listening correct pronunciation, by learning specialized vocabulary and integrates them in communicating with medical specific for medical students. It also provides a replay of morphology and syntax knowledge of the language, embedded in specialized language.</p> <p>The learned concepts will provide a basis for any medical speech act in English.</p> <p>The course aims to teach the basic grammatical structures of the English language and the vocabulary needed for general communication.</p> <p>The part related to the notions of vocabulary involves:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Assimilation of basic terms through properly structured textiles; - Initiation and manipulation / organization of meetings - discussions: summary and presentation of the main issues of a case ;- Presenting and supporting opinions - discussions: expressing agreement and disagreement; - Balancing the advantages and disadvantages - discussions: supporting opinions through a series of consequences; - Elaboration of some suggestions and recommendations - discussions: intensely positive / negative suggestions; - Presentation of alternatives - discussions: justification of choices-alternatives - Accepting and rejecting ideas and proposals-polite, official and standard ways; - Elaboration of arguments, offering reasons, presenting some consequences, warning about some consequences; - Summary and conclusions - approaches in case of interruptions / deviations / digressions; - Summarizing the main points, concluding a meeting; - Verification and discussion of information; - Providing general information, instructions <p>The course takes place starting with the beginner level, continues with the intermediate level, ending with the advanced level.</p> <p>A central objective is the assimilation by students of technical-scientific terms that would allow them to consult the bibliography in that field, as well as to write papers in English.</p> <p>Given the fact that students have the opportunity to study abroad in programs such as "Socrates, Erasmus", the practical course aims to train and develop students' ability to communicate in English. The texts were selected from books and specialty magazines in order to gradually introduce technical-scientific terms, while seeking to update and enrich the notions of general English previously acquired.</p> <p>The course ensures a balance between spoken English (related communicative activities) and grammatical content, between active and passive vocabulary, systematic improvement of the 4 communicative skills: speaking, listening (understanding), reading and writing</p>
